Safer Neighbourhoods Information

BEWARE!

Put building materials out of reach of burglars and car thieves. Please put all bricks, large stones, iron bars and lumps of wood away from your front garden so that thieves can't use them to break into your house or car.

STREET CRIME. Be aware of who is around you. Thieves often commit snatch crimes on bicycles. Carry only the cash and cards that you need.

CAR CRIME is prevalent in our area. Lock all doors when driving and on garage forecourts. Leave nothing valuable on display when parked and ensure all windows are fully closed. Report all car crimes, even if you are not making an insurance claim.

Electrical items: Register serial numbers free on www.immobilise.com .

PROTECT YOUR MOBILE PHONE. Record the unique *IMEI* 15-digit number on your mobile - key in *#06#. Keep the number safe. Do not advertise your phone to thieves. Most thefts occur near bus stops, stations and shops.

Find my iPhone! Download from http://www.apple.com/uk/icloud/find-my-iphone.html before it's stolen.

Cyclists beware! 4 easy steps to safer cycling:

- 1. Record your bike take a photo, log the frame number and register it at https://www.bikeregister.com/. If your bike is stolen, report it to the Police.
- 2. If you are buying a second-hand bike, be vigilant and cover your back. If you buy a stolen bike, even unknowingly, you have no statutory rights. The bike will be recovered and you're unlikely to see a penny.
- 3. Don't be naïve: if you're buying a racing bike for £200 and paying cash, something's not right.
- 4. Always use two different locks (eg. A cable and a D-lock) to secure your bike. A thief will have to carry two tools to steal your bike.

BEWARE!

BOGUS CALLERS (Distraction Burglary) tend to focus on elderly people, pretending to be utility providers, sellers, wanting a glass of water or pretending to need to use your phone for an emergency. Never let strangers into your home without asking for identification. If in doubt, telephone to confirm identities; authentic callers will not object. Bogus callers are

BURGLARY. Lock doors and windows every time you go out. Do not leave keys near front or back doors; burglars can "fish" through letter-boxes. It is advisable to install letterbox guards and to have "sash guards" on ground floor windows.

Stop hiding Burglars! Cut your front hedges down to a maximum of 1.5 metres (about shoulder height) so burglars can't hide behind easily. Hedges should not encroach on the public pavement. October and March are the best times of the year for trimming hedges.
